An action verb explains exactly what the subject of the sentence is doing or has done, and using the right verb is key, as some verbs convey small changes in meaning. Another form by which action verbs or verbs of action are known.

There are an infinite number of verbs in the English language for expressing actions, but to determine if a word is an action verb you must examine the sentence and actually determine that it expresses “something someone can do” when the answer is yes, then you are standing in front of an action verb.
